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Jewish Community Centers setting new standard in early education

Evanston, IL, October 23, 2008 – A new standard in early childhood education is being set by preschoolers and teachers at Jewish Community Centers (JCC) of Chicago with the research-based *InvestiGator Club*TM *Prekindergarten Learning System*. Preschoolers in fifteen JCC classrooms in the Chicago area are beginning the year with an engaging cast of animal investigators, led by Dilly Gator and her friends. Curious young learners will accompany the characters through a series of adventures and investigations that connect to their own experiences and exploration of the world around them.

"The characters really draw the children in, and their excitement is enhanced by the characters," confirms Jennifer Ricciotti, a teacher at Mayer Kaplan JCC Children's Center in Skokie. "When the children identify with a character's traits, it helps build a connection to learning."

Sue Banion, another teacher at Mayer Kaplan has seen the benefits of the program's interactive storytelling features and innovative teaching tools, "You can hear, see, and touch. That makes it come alive. The children's interest in learning has grown."

Since its debut in 2006, *The InvestiGator Club* has become the premier core curriculum for Head Start, private, and public pre-K classrooms determined to provide a comprehensive education in all domains of learning. A growing roster of early childhood specialists endorse the program based on the substantial research base and proven results.
